

2. Protect intellectual property
3. Manage it related risk
4. Avoid potential disaster
5. Maximize ROI

COBIT 5 has evolved from a set of control objective to a suite of publications covering allkey aspects of Governance and Management of Enterprise IT. It is builton:

- a. 5 Principles
- b. 7 Enablers
- c. 4 Dimensions

COBIT 5 empowers the professionals to upgrade skills by adding value. The best practices of COBIT 5, which is the distinct experience of experts from all over the world which help you to add value in any area of enterprise of any area of work. COBIT 5 not only gives you the best practices but also the structured process or systematic approach for implementing to achieve the objectives.

Five Principles of COBIT 5:

1. MEETING STAKEHOLDERS NEEDS: The main purpose of any enterprise is to balance between realization of benefits and optimisation of risk and use of resources to create value for their stakeholders. Each enterprise will have different perspective, hence COBIT 5 can be customised for translating high level enterprise goals into manageable specific, IT related goals.


Basically, the COBIT 5 goals cascade is the mechanism to translate stakeholder needs to specific, actionable and customised enterprise goals; IT related goals and enabler goals.

2. COVERING ENTERPRISE END TO END: COBIT 5 covers all functions and processes within the enterprise. It treats information and related technologies as assets just like any other asset in the enterprise. It integrates Governance of Enterprise IT (GEIT) into Enterprise Governance.

3. APPLYING A SINGLE INTEGRATED FRAMEWORK: COBIT 5 is macro framework / umbrella framework as it aligns with and integrates other latest framework like TOGAF, PMBOK, ITIL, PCI DSS, etc. to provide enterprise wide perspective and get everyone speaking the same language. This generally improves business outcomes and drives better communication. When any framework is used, there are 2 dimensions: Mitigating the Risk and Adding Value. COBIT is the only framework which integrates both the Value and Risk perspective in it.

4. ENABLING HOLISTIC APPROACH: Enablers are anything that can help to achieve objectives of the enterprise. COBIT 5 defines a set of enablers to support the implementation of a comprehensive governance and management system of enterprise IT. There are various frameworks which give you content from different perspective. These 7 enablers of COBIT can be used in any enterprise of any type and provide value.

Seven enablers of COBIT 5: Enablers are driven by the goals cascade. The seven categories of enablers are:

5. SEGREGATING GOVERNANCE FROM MANAGEMENT: In the knowledge and digital age where COBIT has become a critical component for deriving value, it's important to know that management has to be distinguished from the governance.

COBIT 5 Implementation:

For COBIT 5 implementation, ISACA suggests a lifecycle approach based on 7 phases:

Phase 1—What Are the Drivers?

Phase 2—Where Are We Now?

Phase 3—Where Do We Want To Be?

Phase 4—What Needs To Be Done?

Phase 5—How Do We Get There?

Phase 6—Did We Get There?

Phase 7—How Do We Keep the Momentum Going?

Enterprise will use COBIT:

1. For implementing and enhancing Corporate Governance
2. For implementing GEIT (Governance of Enterprise IT)
3. For improving Corporate Governance
4. From the perspective of GRC (Governance, Risk and Compliance)
5. Enhancing and improving Internal Control
6. Optimizing the cost of IT services and technology
7. Supporting compliance with relevant laws, regulations, contractual agreements and policies



E Way Bill Under GST

WHAT IS AN E WAYBILL

EWay Bill is an electronic way bill for movement of goods which can be generated on the eWay Bill Portal. Transport of goods of more than Rs. 50,000 (Single Invoice/bill/delivery challan) in value in a vehicle cannot be made by a registered person without an e-way bill.

Alternatively, Eway bill can also be generated or cancelled through SMS, Android App and by Site-to-Site Integration (through API).

WHEN SHOULD E WAYBILL BE ISSUED?

eWay bill will be generated when there is a movement of goods in a vehicle/ conveyance of value more than Rs. 50,000 (either each Invoice or in (aggregate of all Invoices in a vehicle/ Conveyance) #) –

- *In relation to a 'supply'*
- *For reasons other than a 'supply' (say a return)*
- *Due to inward 'supply' from an unregistered person*

For this purpose, a supply may be either of the following:

- *A supply made for a consideration (payment) in the course of business*
- *A supply made for a consideration (payment) which may not be in the course of business*
- *A supply without consideration (without payment) In simpler terms, the term 'supply' usually means a:
 1. Sale – sale of goods and payment made
 2. Transfer – branch transfers for instance
 3. Barter/Exchange – where the payment is by goods instead of in money*

Therefore, eWay Bills must be generated on the common portal for all these types of movements.

For certain specified Goods, the e-way bill needs to be generated mandatorily even if the Value of the consignment of Goods is less than Rs. 50,000:

1. *Inter-State movement of Goods by the Principal to the Job-worker by Principal/ registered Job-worker,*
2. *Inter-State Transport of Handicraft goods by a dealer exempted from GST registration*



E Way Bill Under GST

WHO SHOULD GENERATE AN EWAYBILL

- **Registered Person** – *Eway bill must be generated when there is a movement of goods of more than Rs 50,000 in value to or from a Registered Person. A Registered person or the transporter may choose to generate and carry e-way bill even if the value of goods is less than Rs 50,000.*
- **Unregistered Persons** – *Unregistered persons are also required to generate e-Way Bill. However, where a supply is made by an unregistered person to a registered person, the receiver will have to ensure all the compliances are met as if they were the supplier.*
- **Transporter** – *Transporters carrying goods by road, air, rail, etc. also need to generate e-Way Bill if the supplier has not generated an e-Way Bill.*
- **Unregistered Transporters** will be issued *Transporter ID* on enrolling on the e-way bill portal after which Eway bills can be generated.

Note: If a transporter is transporting multiple consignments in a single conveyance, they can use the form GST EWB-02 to produce a consolidated e-way bill, by providing the e-way bill numbers of each consignment. If both the consignor and the consignee have not created an e-way bill, then the transporter can do so by filling out PART A of FORM GST EWB-01 on the basis of the invoice/bill of supply/delivery challan given to them.



E Way Bill Under GST

CASES WHEN E WAY BILL IS NOT REQUIRED


- 1) In the following cases it is not necessary to generate e-Way Bill
- 2) The mode of transport is non-motor vehicle
- 3) Goods transported from Customs port, airport, air cargo complex or land customs station to Inland Container Depot (ICD) or Container Freight Station (CFS) for clearance by Customs.
- 4) Goods transported under Customs supervision or under customs seal
- 5) Goods transported under Customs Bond from ICD to Customs port or from one custom station to another.
- 6) Transit cargo transported to or from Nepal or Bhutan
- 7) Movement of goods caused by defence formation under Ministry of defence as a consignor or consignee
- 8) Empty Cargo containers are being transported
- 9) Consignor transporting goods to or from between place of business and a weighbridge for weighment at a distance of 20 kms, accompanied by a Delivery challan.
- 10) Goods being transported by rail where the Consignor of goods is the Central Government, State Governments or a local authority.
- 11) Goods specified as exempt from E-Way bill requirements in the respective State/Union territory GST Rules.
- 12) Transport of certain specified goods- Includes the list of exempt supply of goods, Annexure to Rule 138(14), goods treated as no supply as per Schedule III, Certain schedule to Central tax Rate notifications. (PDF of List of Goods).
- 13) Note: Part B of e-Way Bill is not required to be filled where the distance between the consigner or consignee and the transporter is less than 50 Kms and transport is within the same state.
- 14) He shall file a Quarterly Return in FORM GSTR – 4 and 4A.

HOW TO GENERATE E WAY BILL

E-Way Bill can be generated on the e-Way Bill Portal. All you need is a Portal login.

E Way Bill Under GST

VALIDITY OF E WAYBILL

An e-way bill is valid for periods as listed below, which is based on the distance travelled by the goods. Validity is calculated from the date and time of generation of e-way bill.

TYPE OF CONVEYANCE	DISTANCE	VALIDITY OF E WAY BILL
<i>Other than Over dimensional cargo</i>	<i>Less Than 100 Kms</i>	<i>1 Day</i>
	<i>For every additional 100 Kms or part thereof</i>	<i>additional 1 Day</i>
<i>For Over dimensional cargo</i>	<i>Less Than 20 Kms</i>	<i>1 Day</i>
	<i>For every additional 20 Kms or part thereof</i>	<i>additional 1 Day</i>

Validity of Eway bill can be extended also. The generator of such Eway bill has to either 8 hours before expiry or within 8 hours after its expiry can extend Eway bill validity.


